Net neutrality in Slovenia

- Regulation (should) represent the remedy to reduce market failures and make the future concept sustainable for the growth and further development of the industry in question
- What happened in Slovenia at the end of 2012?
 - ECA with the article 203 (applicable from January 2013)
 - Second EU country with such "solution"
 - Why?
 - Market failures?
 - Inclusive and transparent in-depth public discussion?
 - Impact assessment of such legislation?
 - Nobody could really understand the scope of it, including the relevant stakeholders

Commercial practices (ZR)

- Was there any inconsistency?
- Is the zero rating part of the Article 203?
- The closest paragraph relating to the zero rating was struck out in the Parliament from the ECA prior to its adoption
- 6th paragraph (Article 203 of the ECA)
 - "The Agency may issue a general act for implementation of the provisions of the third, fourth and fifth paragraphs of this Act." ECA with the article 203 (applicable from January 2013)

Zero rating

End of 2014 the official supervisory procedure started

 Slovenian Competition Protection Agency sensibly urged caution in zero rating cases

 Decisions forbidding existing zero rating practices were issued by the NRA in 2015

Litigations could not be avoided

Single and flexible

- TSM/BEREC Guidelines/Slovenian ECA
- Interpretations!
- Past determines the future?
- Telecom <u>SINGLE</u> Market
- We are strongly in favor of predictable, clear, stable and coordinated implementation of the Regulation throughout whole EU, which is the main purpose of the Regulation
 - If the EC would be in favor to have even slight differences, the Net neutrality would/should be regulated with the Directive, which is usually transposed with the recognition of the national circumstances, BUT that was not the case
- In order to have a sustainable growth and further development of the industry in question flexibility must be given to the operators
